With full respect to the Council conclusions on "Strengthening the balance in the pharmaceutical systems in the EU and its Member States" adopted on 16 June 2016, we ask that under your Presidency the following issues are prioritised as part of the EU's health and research agenda:

- addressing the unaffordable prices of medicines that are bankrupting patients and health systems across the continent
- increasing transparency and public accountability around the prices of medicines
- ensuring health research and development investment is tailored toward addressing unmet health needs
- introducing safeguards in biomedical research and innovation to guarantee the maximum social impact of public investment.

We call on you as the Minister of Health to maintain a European pharmaceutical policy agenda that ensures the long-term sustainability of health care systems in Europe and places patients at the center of our health innovation model.
